Saint of the month—ST. BLAISE

Feast Day: February 3<sup>rd</sup>

Blaise was a physician in what is modern-day Turkey who was known for his ability to heal both humans and animals. After a conversion experience, he focused on spiritual illnesses and eventually became bishop of Sebastea. From early times he was associated with ailments of the throat, a designation that apparently arose from the legend that he cured a child who was choking on a fishbone while he was on the way to his own martyrdom.

On his feast day, two crossed candles are used to touch the throats of the faithful while imploring him for protection against diseases of the throat in the coming year.
